From the Pulpit

I have some good news to report. Three weeks ago we took up a second collection to help pay for the land we are purchasing adjacent to Christ the Redeemer in West Bay. Thanks to your generous donations we raised about \$5,000 and as a result, we were able to finish making our payments towards this purchase. The total price for the land we purchased was \$50,000. With that money, we acquired a little over 16,000 square feet of property. Thanks again for your support in this regard, this is definitely happy news for Christ the Redeemer.

Concerning the other second collection we took up last week for World Mission Sunday, again we got another good response. We raised \$4,358. That money will be going to missions around the world helping Catholic missionaries to spread the faith. Not only is this money used to evangelize, but it is also used to help feed and educate the poor and care for the sick. Truly this is a worthwhile cause that you can be proud of supporting.

Speaking of collections, I also wanted to bring up another collection that will be coming up: The Christmas collection. Typically we get around \$8,000 for an average Sunday collection. The Christmas collection last year made \$16,000. At first glance that sounds really good. But the truth of the matter is that at least twice as many people attend Mass on Christmas as compared to Sunday. That tells me that most people aren't giving anything extra at Christmas. To be honest with you, I was a little surprised. Most parishes in the United States make at least three to four times the amount in their Christmas collection. In the United States, it is traditional to give a little extra at Christmas because of the spirit of the season. Besides that, it only makes good sense to do so, the reason is because of this: The Archdiocese of Detroit charges a 6% assessment (tax) on the Sunday collections. This is true for every parish in Detroit. The one collection that is exempt is the Christmas collection. All of the money for the Christmas collection stays here. Now, I don't have anything against the assessment, the Archdiocese needs money to run its offices, and even here in Cayman we do benefit from their services. However, at the same time, saving up a little more money for ourselves is also a good idea. That is why I encourage you to consider budgeting your money this year so that you can give something extra at Christmas.

I have one last piece of news that I am sure you will be interested in: Bishop Quinn has just recently been named as the next bishop of the Diocese of Winona, Minnesota. He will be installed as their bishop on December 11. While I am happy for him, I am also sad because that means he is leaving Detroit, and as a result will no longer be with us. Nevertheless, I am pretty sure I can convince him to come visit us seeing as how those Minnesota winters are so cold. Because of his new assignment however, that also means that he will not be doing Confirmations this February. But please do not panic, I have every reason to believe that somebody else will be coming on February 1st to do them. Who that is, I don't know yet. But when I find out who will be replacing Bishop Quinn, I will be sure to let you know.

SUNDAY REFLECTION The Greatest Commandment

This Week....

In the Gospel, Jesus tells us that loving God is number one, but number two is loving our neighbor, and number two is every much like number one. In case we're not sure who our neighbors are, their identity is spelled out clearly for us in the first reading—anyone who needs help, anyone who does not have the power to take care of their own needs. And in case, we're not sure if this works or not, the success of the Thessalonians to imitate Christ, Paul, and the other early Christians is clearly documented in the second reading. When we imitate Christ, others will imitate us. The way of Jesus works, and it is as simple as the word love.

For your Reflection....

At the same time that young people want more freedom, more rules apply. More freedom just means fewer outside rules. That's because more freedom means more responsibility, and more responsibility means more inside rules—rules that we make for ourselves. For example, the Ten Commandments are outside rules—they tell us exactly what to do. Jesus' two commandments of love are inside rules—they tell us to make rules for ourselves that are motivated by love. Actually, if we make rules for ourselves that are motivated by love, our actions will follow the Ten Commandments, even if we have never heard of the Ten commandments. What are some of your school rules and home rules? Are they outside rules or inside rules? If they are outside rules, summarize them with one inside rule. If any of them are inside rules, then give an outside example of how you might follow them. Would society work if its only laws were inside rules? Why or why not? How would that affect this country? How would affect your state, county or city? Saint Augustine is famous for saying, "Love, and then do what you will." How is this quote similar to what Jesus told the lawyer? What does love of self look like? What does love of God look like? How are those types of love related to love of neighbor? Do you think when Jesus said, "Love your neighbor," he meant just the people on your street or all people—including strangers, people in faraway countries, and even people at school that you don't get along with? How does that sit with you?
