From the Pulpit

This weekend we were supposed to have a special guest speaker, Msgr. Michael Corona, come and give a talk on stewardship at all the Masses. Unfortunately he couldn't come because he was in the hospital for kidney stones. So please keep Msgr. Corona in your prayers for a speedy recovery. Kidney stones are no fun.

Every now and then when people are looking for spiritual advice, I sometimes get asked the question: "I want to be able to give myself over to God more completely, but how do I do it?" Unfortunately, there are no easy answers. First of all you have to be willing to work at it. Make time for prayer, scripture, spiritual reading and learning about the faith. Frequent the sacraments of Eucharist and Reconciliation. Secondly, when we pray, the kind or nature of our prayers can also make a difference. I say this because sometimes people pray for the wrong things. Someone might for example pray for a million dollars, but that isn't very likely going to help them grow closer to God. During my priesthood, I happened across a beautiful prayer which I find helpful, and so I thought that I would share that prayer with you:

Prayer of Abandonment

Father,

I abandon myself into your hands;
do with me what you will.
Whatever you may do, I thank you:
I am ready for all, I accept all.

Let only your will be done in me,
and in all your creatures.
I wish no more than this, O Lord.

Into your hands I commend my soul;
I offer it to you
with all the love of my heart,
for I love you, Lord,
and so need to give myself,
to surrender myself into your hands,
without reserve,
and with boundless confidence,
for you are my Father. Amen.

SUNDAY REFLECTIONS

Commentary:

The World was shocked when the World Trade Center, a temple of commerce and trade, was targeted and destroyed by terrorists in 2001. In the 1990s, one of America's most famous homes underwent millions of dollars of renovation to prevent the home's terraces from collapsing into the stream upon which it was built. Fallingwater, designed by Frank Lloyd Wright, straddles the Bear Run stream in Pennsylvania. It's perched directly above a waterfall. These two paeans of American architecture are secular temples, temporal structures made by humans and revered for their ingenuity. Our readings identify several different temples: God, the human person, the community of believers. The gospel reading presses the metaphor of the temple further by juxtaposing the temple in Jerusalem with the body of Jesus, the most holy temple.

In the first reading, Ezekiel is given a tour of grand temple that is a symbol of our God. He is allowed to inspect the outside of this magnificent structure and he sees and learns that the water flowing from the temple feeds an abundance of life. The metaphorical imagery of living water is a powerful symbol throughout the bible. Water is essential to all life. God's living water is not only nourishing, it is transformative. Here, it flows into a salty sea (Arabah, now known as the Dead Sea), and the waters of life are so abundant that they transform the salt sea into a sea of fresh water. While the water trickles from its source, it matures into a river providing everlasting nourishment to "every type of living creature" and it feeds "fruit trees of every kind". God nourishment makes no distinction about who can receive the water. Visitors, people from other lands who visit the riverbanks, will be provided with food and medicines due to the breadth of God's nourishing abilities.

St. Paul instructs us that we, collectively, as believers in Christ, are God's temple. The community is holy because the Holy Spirit has flowed into each of us and dwells within us. We are God's people who stand along the riverbank drinking in his living water. The nourishing water fills us and is meant to overflow our lives and bear fruit. We are called to live lives that nourish and heal others.

Our challenge is to differentiate the temples of our secular world from the holy temple of God. The world lures us with many temptations that serve to deflect us from our faith journey or to knock us from our foundation. In the gospel, Jesus rebukes the money changers because they have lost their moral bearings, confusing earthly temples with the saving grace of God's most holy temple, Jesus.

God calls us to be mindful of the sacrifice his Son made for us. The grace of God through the Holy Spirit provides us with the foundation to withstand the temptations of this world. But we need constant refreshment.

We gain this renewal through Eucharist celebrated with the community and through quiet reflection. Our churches offer space for both. We find temple space in our homes, too, when we gather as small communities and when we sit silently in a room by ourselves. When we are in tune with Christ, we can find temple space anywhere.

For Your Reflection...

- When you enter your (or any) church, what are your initial thoughts and actions?
- To what extent do you experience your church as sacred space?
- Where do you sit in church? Is it always the same place? Why/why not?
- How has God entered your life to shape, mold, or reshape the walls, doors and windows of your being?
- How does your faith in Christ nourish you?

Fr. Richard Ho Lung-MOPA

You may have seen in the Caymanian Compass recently, that Fr. Richard HoLung, founder of the Missionaries of the Poor, has been awarded the Order of Jamaica for his services to the poor and destitutes.

The Gleaner Newspaper hosted a special luncheon in honour of the 67-year old priest, to recognize this award and to thank him for his years of tireless service to Jamaica's less fortunate.

"It's easy for you to get caught up in these things (awards)", said Fr. Ho Lung, "but you know, it really says something for all the brothers and the work they have done for society's poorest." There are 170 missionary 'brothers' in Jamaica, who help operate the six centers which are home to the country's terminally ill, elderly and abandoned poor. MPO also has centers in the Philippines, India, Haiti, Uganda and Kenya.

If anyone wishes to make a donation to Missionaries of the Poor, there will be envelopes at the back of the church for this purpose. These may be put in the collection baskets or given to May Ursua in the office.
