## From the Pulpit

This bulletin article is a little bit overdue. Each year in October the Department of Children and Family Services here in Cayman sponsors an International Day of Older Persons. They sponsor this day so as to raise awareness about the many positive contributions that older persons make to society. This is especially important for us to reflect on in today's world as older persons have become a very significant demographic group in the Western world. In fact, at the beginning of the twentieth century, only one in every twenty-five people in the United States was over 65, while at the end of the twentieth century, one in eight people were at least 65. Without a doubt, people are living longer.

In the late Pope John Paul II's encyclical, "On the Family," he says that "The pastoral activity of the church must help everyone to discover and to make good use of the role of the elderly within the civil and ecclesial community, in particular within the family. In fact, "the life of the aging helps to clarify a scale of human values; it shows the continuity of generations and marvelously demonstrates the interdependence of God's people. The elderly often have the charism to bridge generation gaps before they are made: How many children have found understanding and love in the eyes and words and caresses of the aging! And how many old people have willingly subscribed to the inspired word that the 'crown of the aged is their children's children!'"

In a world where many are quick to judge others in materialistic terms where people are defined as being either useful to society or a burden, older persons serve as a reminder to us that our lives are much deeper and meaningful and that our value goes beyond what we do and go to the inner core of who and what we are as human beings. Without that witness, we become much more susceptible to treating others in a manner that is not respectful of the dignity of the human person. Therefore, the contributions of older persons is not only valuable but also very necessary for the sake of having a stable and healthy society. That is why it is so important for us to make sure that we show appreciation and acknowledge the value of our older persons in our families and in our community.

Many people have inquired about what we are going to do as a community to assist those in the aftermath of Hurricane Paloma on our sister islands. The government seems to be doing a good job of organizing the relief effort and determining what is needed. In addition, the Catholic community on Cayman Brac are still trying to determine themselves what sort of things they might need the most in the coming weeks ahead. That is why I think it would be best that we take up a second collection for disaster relief, and then we can use that money to buy the things we need to donate for our brothers and sisters on our sister islands. Therefore next weekend, the 22<sup>nd</sup> and 23<sup>rd</sup> of November, there will be a second collection for the express purpose of disaster relief on our sister islands, most especially for the Catholic community on Cayman Brac.

## Fr. Richard Ho Lung-MOPA

You may have seen in the Caymanian Compass recently, that Fr. Richard HoLung, founder of the Missionaries of the Poor, has been awarded the Order of Jamaica for his services to the poor and destitutes.

The Gleaner Newspaper hosted a special luncheon in honour of the 67-year old priest, to recognize this award and to thank him for his years of tireless service to Jamaica's less fortunate.

"It's easy for you to get caught up in these things (awards)", said Fr. Ho Lung, "but you know, it really says something for all the brothers and the work they have done for society's poorest." There are 170 missionary 'brothers' in Jamaica, who help operate the six centers which are home to the country's terminally ill, elderly and abandoned poor. MPO also has centers in the Philippines, India, Haiti, Uganda and Kenya.

If anyone wishes to make a donation to Missionaries of the Poor, there will be envelopes at the back of the church for this purpose. These may be put in the collection baskets or given to May Ursua in the office.

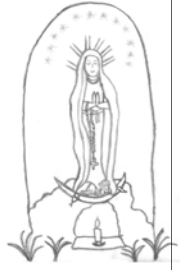

## SUNDAY REFLECTION

### USING OUR TALENTS

#### This week....

Although the Book of Proverbs was written in a patriarchal society that viewed a wife as a possession, the first reading today still praises skill and labor above charm and beauty. This praise was countercultural at the time. In the second reading, the author warns the people to not be lazy, but to be alert and ready for the "day of Lord" (end of the world). For they were certain Jesus was returning to earth in their own lifetimes. In the Gospel, Jesus praises the servants, who take risks and work hard, not the servant who buries what he is given out of fear.

#### For Your Reflection....

In the parable that Jesus tells in today's Gospel, the master praises the actions of the first two servants, who used the talents they were given and improved upon them. The master criticizes the action of the third servant, who hid the talent, and did nothing, and was paralyzed with fear. When have you been like the first and second servant, using your talents in a way that benefits yourself and others? When have you been like the third servant, not using your talents and bringing benefit to yourself and others? The last few lines of the Gospel might seem to contradict Jesus' usual message about last being first. The passage appears to be saying that the first will be even further ahead, and the last will be left behind. Is this contradiction troubling you? Why or why not? How do you see it? When Jesus speaks of the first becoming last and the last becoming first, he is usually speaking of humility and boastfulness. Those who pump themselves up are usually full of hot air. Why would Jesus say the humble ones are really the great ones? When Jesus speaks of the rich ones getting more the poor ones losing what they have, he is speaking in terms of laziness and activity. Those who act lazy usually become lazy, and they lose any initiative they once had. What kind of activity is Jesus encouraging us to do?
