January 11, 2009– Baptism of the Lord

From the Paulpit

I have some exciting news out of Detroit. Last Monday it was announced that Pope Benedict named a new Archbishop for Detroit. The letter that the Archdiocese has sent to all the parishes states that,

Pope Benedict XVI has named Bishop Allen Vigneron, 60, of the Diocese of Oakland, California, as the new Archbishop of Detroit. Installation of the new archbishop has been scheduled for Wednesday, January 28, at Detroit's Blessed Sacrament Cathedral.

As required by Church law, Cardinal Maida submitted his resignation to the Holy Father when he turned 75, in March of 2005. Pope Benedict then invited Cardinal Maida to continue as Archbishop of Detroit. Cardinal Maida's resignation has now been accepted; he will, however, serve as apostolic administrator of the archdiocese during this month's transition.

Archbishop-elect Vigneron was born in Mt. Clemens, Michigan and grew up in Immaculate Conception Parish, Anchorville. He attended Immaculate Conception Grade School before going on to Detroit's Sacred Heart Seminary High School and College. Later, he studied at the Pontifical Gregorian University in Rome and the Catholic University of America in Washington D.C.

Prior to being named Bishop of Oakland, California, in 2003, Archbishop-elect Vigneron was an auxiliary bishop for the Archdiocese of Detroit. His background includes assignments as rector/president of Sacred Heart Major Seminary in Detroit, work in the Administrative Section of the Vatican Secretariat of State, and service as associate pastor at Our Lady Queen of Peace Parish, Harper Woods, Michigan.

Now that we have a new Archbishop, hopefully we will soon have some more auxiliary bishops ordained for Detroit so that we will once again have one of them officially assigned to us as the Archbishop's representative. If you remember, last month Bishop Quinn was installed as bishop of the Diocese of Winona, Minnesota. As a result, we are going to have someone else come here to do the Confirmations on February 1st. That someone is Bishop Reiss, who is only one of two remaining active auxiliary bishops in Detroit.

Last of all, you might be interested in knowing that our former pastor, Fr. Mike Molnar, is here visiting us for a week. If you see him, be sure to give him a warm welcome.

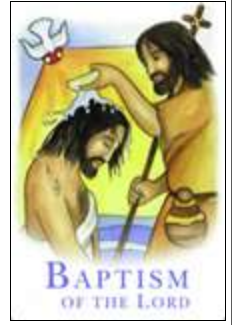

SUNDAY REFLECTION SUNDAY ALIVE



Mark records Jesus baptism in a brief note—no more than four verses in his first chapter. Nevertheless, it is one of the most important events in Jesus' public ministry and one we are invited to ponder and reflect on today, when the whole Church contemplates the deeper meaning of Jesus' baptism.

Jesus' public life began with his baptism by John in the Jordan. John the Baptist preached the necessity for baptism—a baptism in water and for repentance. Although Mark does not record this fact, we know that on the day Jesus was baptized, a crowd of sinners gathered to be baptized too: fishermen, carpenters, housewives, tax collectors, soldiers, prostitutes.... Jesus blended in with the grey mass of sinners waiting to be baptized on the banks of the River Jordan. It's an amazing image, isn't it?

Consider this if you will: confession of sins was a component of baptism. So too was an attempt to put off an old, failed life and to receive a new one. Was this something Jesus could do? How could he confess his sins? How could he separate himself from his previous life to start a new one? The act of descending into the waters of this baptism implied a confession of guilt and a plea for forgiveness in order to make a new beginning. Jesus was baptized in the Jordan to fulfill all righteousness. His baptism revealed his acceptance of his mission as the suffering Servant. He freely and deliberately chose to be numbered among sinners. His baptism in the Jordan anticipates his death on the cross, upon which he who had no sin became sin in order to liberate us and us free. Through being baptized in the Jordan Jesus is consenting to the baptism of his cross for the remission of our sins. Through him, with him and in him the Blessed Trinity unite in an expression of love and communion. The Father's voice responds to the Son's acceptance, proclaiming his delight and favour in his beloved Son; the Spirit whom Jesus possessed in fullness from his conception comes to rest on him.

*'Lord Jesus, I rejoice in the gift and grace of my baptism.
I too must enter the mystery of baptism with its humble self-abasement and repentance and go down into the water with Jesus in order to rise with him, be re-born of water and the Spirit, and walk in the newness of life'*
