From the Paulpit

This Saturday, the 17th, we are beginning our novena to St. Paul the Apostle in honor of the Pauline Jubilee Year. The novena ends on Sunday, the 25th of January, which is the feast day of the Conversion of St. Paul. The novena begins each night at 7:00 pm. When considering what intention should we specifically pray for during this novena, it seemed to me that there was one that really stood out, particularly at this time of year. The intention that I propose we pray for is for the right to life movement and the conversion of hearts to a culture of life. This is especially important considering what is now happening in the United States and elsewhere around the world.

In the United States, January 22nd marks the 36th anniversary of the U.S. Supreme Court decision in the Roe v. Wade case to legalize abortion. Today, the U.S. congress is also considering a piece of legislation called, the Freedom of Choice Act. If the Freedom of Choice Act (FOCA) is passed, it would nullify the common-sense restrictions that have helped lower the number of abortions in the U.S. It would for example automatically overturn state abortion reporting requirements in all 50 states; and 44 states' laws concerning parental involvement. In other words, parents would no longer have to be notified if their teenage daughter is seeking an abortion.

FOCA would also overturn 40 states' laws on restricting later term abortions, 38 states' bans on partial-birth abortions, 33 states' laws on requiring counseling before an abortion, and 16 states' laws concerning ultrasounds before an abortion. Last of all, FOCA would also overturn 40 states' conscious protection laws for individual health care providers and 27 states' conscious protection laws for institutions. In other words, health care workers and health care institutions will not be allowed to consciously object to providing or assisting others in having an abortion. Essentially, this is a rejection of freedom of religion. With the FOCA, abortions will also be funded with taxpayer dollars, and it could also make protesting in front of abortion clinics illegal.

Now that the congress is overwhelmingly democratic (which is overwhelmingly pro-abortion), and Barack Obama has stated that he would sign the FOCA into law, there is a real chance that this could become the law of the land. This effects us in the Cayman Islands because the U.S. isn't going to stop trying to enforce its ideology at its own borders, for better or worse. They have the ability to put pressure on the international community to adopt similar laws. We need to be vigilant and unified in our stance for life, and pray for those who are caught up in the culture of death. St. Paul is the ultimate story of conversion. Pray through the intercession of St. Paul for the conversion of hearts so that everyone may truly respect all life.

SUNDAY REFLECTION We Are Called

This Week....

We are being called. Sometimes we don't realize it at first. Like Samuel we are asleep, or we need someone wise to help us discern our calling. Sometimes we do realize it, and we must change our life, as Paul suggests, to reflect the holiness of our call. Sometimes it is more obvious, as if Jesus is boldly asking us what we're looking for. What are we being called to? Discipleship.

For Your Reflection.....

Samuel is a young person, living with Eli, who is his spiritual guide. Samuel is inexperienced, and he needs Eli to walk him and experience life with him so he is not alone. Who is a spiritual guide for you? Who is an adult with life experience whom you can trust and open up to when you have deep questions of the heart. How does this take place? When has this helped you? God calls Samuel as God calls each of us. Samuel needs Eli's help to understand God's call, and Eli help Samuel to listen and be open to what God has to say. Do you really listen to God? Do you think you are open to what God has to say to you? How can you improve in this area? In the Gospel Jesus asks the curious passerby what they are looking for. What are you looking for in life? What do you think most people are looking for? Do you think Jesus is the answer to everything most people are looking for? If not, why not? If so, why? And if so, why don't most people realize that Jesus is the answer? In the Gospel, Jesus invites curious one to "come and see" what his life is all about. What do think Jesus' life is all about? If you invite a complete stranger to "come and see" what your life is all about, what would they think about you and your values and priorities after following you around for a week?

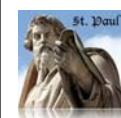
