### February 08, 2009– Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time

## From the Paulpit

This Wednesday, February 11, is the feast day of Our Lady of Lourdes. The apparitions of the Blessed Virgin Mary that took place in Lourdes has had a profound effect on the devotional life in the Catholic Church. As a result, it is today a very popular pilgrimage site in southwestern France. So what happened in this apparition, and why was it so popular?

On February 11, 1858, Bernadette Soubirous, a poor shepherdess of the age of 14, was tending the flocks on the outside of town. As she was praying before the grotto of Massabielle beside the Gave River, she saw a beautiful lady clothed in white and blue with roses at her feet and a rosary hanging from her arm. On relating the incident to her mother, the mother thought that Bernadette was demented and forbade her to go there again. The next Sunday, however, her mother relented and allowed her and her sisters to visit the place, where she again saw the beautiful lady. Word of Bernadette's visions spread quickly so that by March, a crowd of 20,000 people had gathered to witness her apparitions.

On one occasion, this beautiful lady instructed her to bathe and "drink of the fountain." Bernadette looked around and could see no fountain, but presently one sprang up and flowed over the rocks where she dug. Shortly thereafter, people began to discover that there seemed to be many cures from illnesses associated with this water. On another occasion, on March 24 of that year, this beautiful lady instructed her that a chapel should be built there in honor of the Blessed Virgin Mary. And on the following day, after Bernadette asked her who she was, the beautiful lady replied, "I am the Immaculate Conception." Bernadette was relatively uneducated and had not even received her first communion at that point, so she wouldn't have even known what an Immaculate Conception was, but nevertheless she relayed all of this to her parish priest. As a result, this apparition confirmed for many the dogma that was recently declared by Pope Pius IX in 1854 that Mary was indeed immaculately conceived without sin.

Bernadette had a total of 18 apparitions, the last one occurring on July 16, 1858. By then hordes of pilgrims were coming there seeking cures in the miraculous waters. Bernadette herself ended up spending the rest of her life as a humble nun. She died in 1879 at the age of 35. She was canonized a saint in 1933. To this day, Lourdes continues to serve as one of the most important pilgrimage sites in the world, attracting over two million visitors each year. Of the reported five thousand cures, 58 have been declared miraculous by church officials.

### GOSPEL REFLECTION

#### Gospel Summary.....

We learn several important pieces of information for this gospel passage. First, Simon Peter had a mother-in-law. When we read previously that he left his fishing boat to follow Jesus, we can safely assume that he left much more than that. He had a family at home and we hear in this gospel of Jesus healing Peter's mother-in-law. Also, this gospel helps us recognize the need Jesus had to be away from the crowds and confusion to take time to pray and become revitalized and strengthened for his ministry.

#### Reflection for Families...

This gospel is especially helpful for parents. Many (maybe most) nights we fall into bed exhausted from a day of responsibilities. Perhaps it was our intention throughout the day to find time to pray, but sometimes we just don't get to it. At the end of the day, we resolve to talk with God, but wake in the morning to find out we fell asleep before we finished the prayer. Jesus gives us the example that we must take the time away from the busyness and demands of our lives to be fortified and strengthened to meet the most important responsibilities we have—that is the spiritual formation of our children and our family.

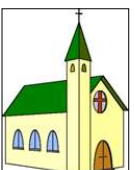
**Dorothy Dennis and Maria Testori** for their kind donations of meals over the retreat weekend.
