### February 22, 2009 – Seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time

## From the Paulpit

Once again, Lent is just around the corner, in fact it begins this Wednesday to be precise. It is always interesting to hear about the different traditions that people have on the day before Ash Wednesday, which is sometimes otherwise known as "Fat Tuesday." People from Trinidad for example love to tell me about their carnival. Even in Detroit, where I am from, we have our own traditions on Fat Tuesday. Nothing elaborate like carnival (its too cold to have a celebration in the streets anyway). In Detroit we eat paczki (pronounced like "punch - kee"). This tradition is actually found in numerous Midwestern cities in the United States that have a sizable number of people with Polish ancestry. As you may have already guessed, paczkis are of Polish origin. The best way to describe them is that they are like jelly filled doughnuts, but only more fattening. Paczkis have been known to exist in Poland at least since the middle ages. The reason for making them was so as to use up all the lard, sugar, eggs and fruit in the house, which were forbidden during Lent. The tradition of eating paczkis continued in the U.S. wherever there were large numbers of Polish immigrants, and has since then expanded its influence due in part to successful marketing by the bakery industry. As a result, it is hard to find an office in the Detroit area these days that doesn't have a box of paczki sitting around on Fat Tuesday.

One interesting cultural phenomenon that has resulted from "paczki day" is the emergence of the "Paczki Challenge", which is an eating contest where individuals attempt to race from one side of a room while eating as many paczki as they can before they reach the other side of the room. The person who arrives first and has eaten the most paczki wins. It's a hoot, really. And to think, you thought carnival in Trinidad was fun. If nothing else, it gives us even more reason to begin fasting the next day.

As for Lent, Ash Wednesday is the official beginning and occurs on February 25 this year. Our Mass times with the distribution of ashes will be 8:00 am and 12 noon at St. Ignatius, and then 9:45 am at Christ the Redeemer. Ash Wednesday is a day of both fasting and abstinence. All Fridays during Lent are days of abstinence. We will be doing the Stations of the Cross on Fridays during Lent at 5:30 pm. The fish fry on Fridays during Lent will not start up until the following week, March 6<sup>th</sup>, and will then continue each Friday for the next four Fridays. We will also be having a communal reconciliation service on Tuesday, March 3<sup>rd</sup> at 6:30 pm at St. Ignatius because I will have three other priests available to help out with confessions that day. Of course there will be more times available for confession the closer we come to Holy Week. Those times will be forth coming in the bulletin in the weeks to come.

## Dear Padre ? Why are there different versions of the Bible?

Why don't all the Bibles agree? I notice differences in different Bibles. Aren't they all translated from the same documents?

**Dear Paul,**

All modern Bibles are translations, either from an earlier Bible or, more usually, from the oldest sources that are available. Translations, though, are difficult things. Languages are connected to a culture. In different cultures, people not only use different words, but they think differently.

There are two fundamental ways of translating from one language to another. One is a literal translation. A word in one language is matched with a word in another language. Literal translations are faithful to the original, but the meaning can be obscure.

The other basic way of translating is dynamic. You think of this as translating meanings from one language to another and not just words. Dynamic translations usually read easier and make more sense to contemporary people, but the meaning is filtered through the translator. That can be an issue when it comes to the Bible.

The reason there are differences in different versions of the Bible is because there are different translators. Some Bibles are better for studying and others may be easier to read. It is not a bad idea to have different translations of the Bible. Every Christian should read the Bible

## GOSPEL REFLECTIONS

Jesus miraculously healed the sick and his work continues through the Church, which has been entrusted with the commission to 'heal the sick' (Matt. 10:8). Every year millions of pilgrims descend on the Marian shrine at Lourdes seeking healing, blessing and anointing and over the years many wonderful miracles have occurred. One of the more recent involved a man called Mr. Bely who up until that day had been confined to a wheelchair. After receiving the Sacrament of Anointing he heard an audible voice saying to him: 'Stand up and walk.' And he did just that! His healing was recently declared an official miracle, confirming it was the result of a miraculous intervention which medical science could not explain.

Knowing that God can and does heal raises the problem of why we don't see more miracles, more signs and wonders, a greater manifestation of God's grace and power over sickness and disease. Valid and valuable as this question is, we can't really know the answer—it is a mystery why one person is chosen and another is not. What we do know is that God has the power to raise up and heal whoever he wants, and our task is to pray for the sick and avail ourselves of the sacrament of anointing, which makes Christ's healing touch real and present to us.

The healing of the paralytic in today's Gospel highlights the truth that, whatever physical needs, we also have a need to receive God's forgiveness. Jesus' healing of the man began not with his very immediate physical need but with the forgiving of his sins (v.5), even though he himself was not seeking forgiveness. It was as if the Lord first identified his deepest spiritual need before he proceeded to set him free from his physical need.

There is not one of us who is not in need of Christ's mercy and healing. Jesus is the great physician whose goal is to heal and restore us so that we are able to fulfill God's original purpose for our lives. God's intention is that we should be fully alive, in this life as well as in the life to come.
