From the Pulpit

On Thursday this week we will be celebrating the feast day of St. Joseph. This feast day is actually a solemnity, which is a fancy way of saying that it is a feast day of high importance in the Church. One reason why it is so important to us is because St. Joseph holds the title of Patron or Protector of the Church. Of course, since God entrusted Joseph with the responsibility of protecting Mary and Jesus, who better to be given the responsibility of protecting the Church?

At first sight, Joseph may seem to be a rather unremarkable figure, for what do we know of him apart from his name, that he was a simple artisan, and a few events that occurred in Our Lord's childhood? The Gospel does not even record a single word from him. But nevertheless, it was that humble figure that was so near to Jesus and Mary, so intimately connected with their life, who was given the awesome responsibility to guide and protect God's own Son. It was Joseph's attention to the angels which spoke in his sleep, it was that prompt and generous obedience which caused him to take on the commitment of a family at God's request, and the work and service he gave in order to provide for his family that made his life heroic.

St. Joseph is a model for all husbands and fathers of what it means to be of total service to God and family; to give of oneself and sacrifice oneself for the sake of the family. Without discussion or fanfare, Joseph just simply did whatever God asked of him. He reminds us then that in order to be a great Christian, there is no need of "great things," instead, it is enough to have the common, simple, human virtues, as long as they are true and authentic. His destiny was tied up and dependent upon humility, obedience and service. It was those qualities that made him great, and it is those qualities that we need to imitate if we wish to be great as well.

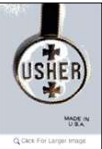

GOSPEL REFLECTIONS

The image many have of Jesus as gentle, meek, and mild is in sharp contrast to the Jesus we encounter in the temple courts. He makes a whip out of cord and drives out the cattle and sheep destined for sacrifice; he turns over the tables of the moneylenders, scattering their coins; and to those selling doves he says: 'Get these out of here! How dare you turn my Father's house into a market!' (v. 16NIV)

It has to be said that this incident in Jesus' life is a perplexing one. Perhaps the clue to its meaning is given in the last verse: 'many believed in his name when they saw the signs which he did' (v.25). The cleansing of the temple is one of the signs in St. John's Gospel. Each of these signs reveals something about the nature of Jesus and his salvific work. This particular one highlights the temple and reveals Jesus as the new temple—the new place where men and women are to come to know the presence of God in their lives and to be united to him in praise and worship.

Jesus makes two points about the temple: the first is that a destruction needs to occur, and the second is that out of this ruin and devastation a new temple will be raised up. This is an image of the death and resurrection of Jesus. AS the Lord himself says: 'Destroy this temple, and in three days I will raise it up' (v. 19). Jesus has replaced the temple; he is the new Temple, if you like. Jesus is now the place where we can draw close to the presence and glory of God. Jesus is the fulfillment of all that the temple meant for Israel, including its purpose in revealing sin.

Sin could not be destroyed by the destruction of the temple, but it was destroyed by the death of Jesus because Jesus took sinful humanity with him to the cross. The cross and resurrection has established a new temple where true worship of God can take place. Jesus has removed the barrier, the dividing wall of hostility, and reconciled us to the Father.

'Lord Jesus, you are the New Temple: the holy Temple of your body was pierced and broken for us, Grant me today the gift of worship and praise as I delight in your cross by which you have redeemed the world.'
