From the Pulpit

Holy Week is upon us, and it is appropriately named because this is the holiest week of the year. This is the week we remember and celebrate the very events that have saved us from sin and death, the suffering, death and resurrection of Jesus Christ. This is the core of our faith. In preparation of this sacred time of our liturgical year, we still have a couple more days offered for confession. Tuesday and Wednesday starting at 6:00 pm, Fr. Alex and myself will be available in the church. If you can't make these times, you may call and set up an appointment.

Our Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday begins at 7:00 pm at St. Ignatius only. There will be no Mass at Christ the Redeemer. St. Ignatius will be open after Mass until 12:00 midnight for adoration of the Blessed Sacrament.

On Good Friday, at both St. Ignatius and Christ the Redeemer, we will begin at 12:00 noon with the stations of the cross, followed by Good Friday service at 1:00 pm. The collection on Good Friday is for the Holy Land foundation. This is one of the universal Catholic collections taken up all over the world and sanctioned by the Pope, so you know that this money is going where it is truly needed.

The Easter Vigil Mass begins at 7:00 pm at St. Ignatius. Again, there will be no Mass on Holy Saturday at Christ the Redeemer. The Easter Vigil will begin outside of the church, where we will all process together into the church.

On Easter Sunday, the schedule for St. Ignatius and Christ the Redeemer will be the same except that there will be an added Mass at St. Ignatius at 9:45 am.

I hope and pray that this Holy Week celebration will be a time of spiritual growth and consolation for you. Of course, in order to get the most out of Holy Week, it is helpful to put in the effort by participating as much as possible in the liturgical sacraments and celebrations that are offered, as well as spending a little extra time in prayer. Since this is the holiest week of the year, we should do whatever we can to make sure that this is reflected in our lives so that it isn't just "business as normal." Instead, it should be a time that is very special for us because of the added awareness we have placed on the very events that have saved us from sin and death and brought us eternal life.

Last of all, I want to make you aware that in a couple of weeks, Dr. Ruppertsberger, a gynecologist from Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, is going to be giving an engaging talk at 9:15 am on Sunday the 19th over at St. Ignatius School. The presentation will be on sex, marriage, the theology of the body, and birth control. I would like to invite all of the adults in our parish, and in particular, married couples to this presentation. In fact, I would say that it is important for you to do so because it is hard to present these topics in a 10 minute homily on Sunday, and it is not easy to talk about them at length in front of kids. As a result, you don't get a full breath of the teaching of the church on these subjects just by attending church on Sunday morning, and these subjects are something that deeply effect us in our efforts to live the Christian life. It has been my experience that few people really know exactly what the church teaches concerning these topics, and even fewer know why. Therefore, save this date and time on your calendar now, plan on attending. If you haven't heard Dr. Ruppertsberger speak in the past, I am certain you will come away learning something that would be important, valuable and worthwhile to you. There will be more information on this presentation in next weeks bulletin.

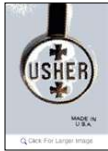

GOSPEL REFLECTIONS

Bear in mind today as you read St. Mark's account of Jesus' Passion that his brutal death was not the result of chance or an unfortunate coincidence of circumstances but part of the mystery of God's plan. In other words, every detail, every movement, every nuance, every word, action and event was precisely according to God's definite plan and foreknowledge. As we saw yesterday, this does not mean that all the key players were merely passive—they were not—but be conscious and aware of the heartbeat of God's purpose and Jesus' authority freely to lay down his life and freely to take it up again.

All four Evangelists highlight the crucifixion as the reason why the Son of God became man. He was destined to suffer to die and to raise us up with him. Underpinning all of this is love: God's love for us. Jesus' heart was full of the Father's love for each one of us. He spent himself out of love for us and the cross became the source of our eternal salvation. Jesus' death on the cross justifies every human being who believes in him—it makes us righteous and holy and pleasing to God.

God the Father wants us to believe, follow and worship his Son Jesus, acknowledging him as our Saviour. This is why our prayers as we enter into Holy Week has to be: 'Hail, O Cross, our only hope'. Jesus' death is the most important death in human history because it alone saved the human race. His cross was a unique sacrifice and Jesus is the one and only mediator between God and humankind. As God incarnate he has united himself to each and every one of us and holds out to each and every one of us the opportunity to be sharers or partners in his Paschal Mystery.

We are all called to take up our cross and follow Christ, for just as he suffered, so too must we. Our vocation is to follow in Jesus' steps. Our hope and prayer is that in this most holy and special of weeks each of us can grow in our love, devotion and worship of Jesus on the cross: the crucified One is the Saviour of the world.
