From the Pulpit

As many of you already know, our Archbishop, Archbishop Vigneron, is making his first pastoral visit here to the Cayman Islands this week. He will be doing our Confirmation Mass which is at 9:30 this Sunday (the 24th). Archbishop Vigneron, if you recall, was installed as our new Archbishop exactly one year ago (January 28th) following Cardinal Maida's retirement. Therefore we are very much privileged that Archbishop Vigneron will be celebrating his one year anniversary with us.

Concerning Confirmation, for all of those candidates who will be receiving this sacrament, I wish to give you a big congratulations and pray that through this sacrament, the spirit will work in you and help draw you further into your faith and your relationship with God. Just as when the Holy Spirit came down upon the apostles and inspired them to go out and give witness about Jesus Christ, our church community will pray that this outpouring of the Holy Spirit through the sacrament of Confirmation will inspire in you a desire to give witness to the Lord through words and action so that everyone may know and live the good news that brings us life.

Sometimes we can easily take for granted the things that we have, especially if it is something that we have never been without. In this Sunday's first reading, it describes an assembly worshipping before the Lord with great emotion. Upon reading this passage, a person might be tempted to think, "So what, what does this assembly worshipping have to do with me or my life? This reading doesn't have a point." Admittedly, it can certainly seem that way until that is, you understand the context of this reading. The context of the reading is this: Immediately after the Babylonian exile (which took place about 500 years before Jesus Christ and lasted for 70 years), the Jewish people were finally allowed to go back to their home in Palestine and worship the way they wanted to. This reading describes this situation, and now the people are finally for the first time worshipping the Lord freely the way they wish in their own home land and listening to the law of God that is part of their heritage as a nation. This was the ultimate sign of their liberty and freedom. The law of God, was in a sense, their constitution.

Sometimes it is hard for us to imagine that coming to church, worshipping God, learning about the Commandments and God's laws – it's a very real, concrete way of experiencing our liberty and freedom. But that is exactly what it is. Jesus came to give liberty to captives, his laws and commandments that the church hands on to us frees us, it doesn't oppress us. These teachings help us to know about the infinite dignity and worth of every human being. These teachings help us to know how to make good, healthy life choices that brings us into union with God's love. These teachings help us to avoid the pitfalls and sophistries that bring disharmony and misery into our lives. Being connected with our Lord and Savior keeps us free from the tyrannical slavery of sin, despair and death. That is why we can't take for granted what we do here every Sunday. If we lose our faith and let it slip away, then we only end up letting our freedom and liberty slip away as well. Therefore, don't let that happen, always appreciate and live out our Catholic faith, and you will experience the true freedom and liberty that we all desire in life.
